- **Education** — OOWA is dedicated to increasing the competency and skill level of its members with the OOWA Registered Professional Program.

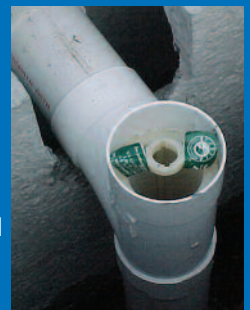


The Ontario Onsite Wastewater Association members have expertise in a variety of areas ranging from design to complex construction to research and education.
