The Technician, based out of the Stoney Creek office with travel to construction sites and facilities, is responsible for the mechanical installation, repair, and maintenance of equipment and systems.

The Technician may also be required to provide OIT assistance at Clearford's water and wastewater facilities throughout Ontario. Reporting to the Overall Responsible Operator, the Technician will ensure operations comply with all applicable legislation, regulations, orders, and guidelines.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES: (This is not an exhaustive list of duties to be performed):

Technician

- Installs a variety of mechanical equipment, piping and systems;
- Performs and monitors equipment and system related tests to ensure performance, regulatory and legislative compliance, and health & safety;
- Inspects and evaluates the condition of equipment and facilities, and provide recommendations for preventive maintenance;
- Troubleshoots and repairs mechanical equipment and systems as required;
- Carries out routine maintenance procedures and part replacements;
- Maintains an accurate record of all installations, evaluations, and repairs;
- Maintains an accurate and timely submission of service reports and manufacturer required documentation;
- Searches, evaluates, and analyzes existing mechanical and systems documentation;
- Performs and/or reviews research on new technical developments and practices as they relate to mechanical equipment and systems;

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- Performs all work consistent with company safety practices without risk to self or others.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, EXPERIENCE, & COMPETENCIES:

- Community college diploma in construction or equivalent combination of education and experience;
- 5 years experience in mechanical installations and troubleshooting;
- Demonstrated knowledge of mechanical installation, maintenance, and repair of systems and equipment;
- Basic knowledge of applicable legislation and regulations (for example, Occupational Health & Safety Act, Drinking Water Standards, Drinking Water Protection Regulations, Safe Drinking Water Act, Spills Act, etc.);
- Good understanding of the latest technologies in the Water and Wastewater industry;
- Excellent diagnostic and troubleshooting skills and repair with minimum interruption to production;
- Problem-solving and troubleshooting skills and a willingness to develop and grow these on the job;
- Able to document and produce accurate paperwork maintaining records of installations, evaluations, repairs, and compliance;
- Ability to produce sound technical reports;
- Strong attention to detail and the ability to prioritize and organize work;
- Ability to handle assignments demanding critical judgement and analytical thinking;
- Excellent customer service and interpersonal skills and the ability to build collaborative relationships with customers and co-workers;
